Rules

- All initiatives should be lawful and legal. The Code of Fundraising Practice gives guidance on the law and best practice in all types of fundraising activity and can be found at www.institute-of-fundraising.org.uk. Further information will be sent to participating teams when entry is confirmed.
- During the period of the Challenge you should not put yourself or any colleague or event participant at risk of injury.
- Other people may join or form teams, provided at least one principal team member is an employee of the company/organisation registered.
- There is no entry fee but each participating team must sign the entry form to confirm that they will not exceed their £1,000 start up kitty.
- All initiatives must be submitted to the Development Team at Papworth Trust by 31st October. This is to enable our mentors and the fundraising team to tailor their advice to each particular team's fundraising initiative.
- All teams must submit budgetary evidence that they have not exceeded the £1,000 start up kitty limit.
- We encourage participants to gain match funding and this will be taken into account when awarding the prize for the team raising the most money from their initiative.
- No entries will be accepted after 22nd September 2008
- As a registered charity, the charity number 211234 must be stated on all documents that promote fundraising initiatives for the Papworth Trust.
- Making misleading statements in advertising can give rise to criminal offences as well as civil litigation. Further information can be obtained from the Committee of Advertising Practice (www.cap.org.uk)
- People with disabilities must not be unlawfully discriminated against in relation to the initiative. Further information is available from (www.equalityhumanrights.com). Similar laws apply to discrimination on the grounds of sex and race.
